- <u>Alberta.ca website</u> The City of Calgary is saving money and reducing greenhouse gas emissions with support from the Alberta Municipal Solar Program.
- Simon Fraser University is set to start construction on a new biomass plant. The new energy utility will use biomass, recycled urban and construction wood waste as its primary fuel source. The purpose of this plant is to reduce SFU greenhouse gas emissions by 80%.
- <u>CAPP website</u> Methane plan can cut emissions by 45%, protect 7000 jobs.
- <u>Canadian Wind Energy Association website</u> Wind farmers and fisherman in Canada repair equipment during the winter months.
   Wind farmers are harvesting as much power as they can.
- <u>CBC News website</u> Textiles are the next frontier in recycling for cities looking to cut waste. A recent study conducted in Ontario concluded 85 per cent of discarded textiles ended up in a landfill site, meaning just 15 per cent are recycled or reused. H&M Clothing store in Edmonton recycles textiles.
- Website Washington Residents are warned their recyclables will end up in landfills. China will only accept products that have a 0.3 percent contamination rate, something industry groups said is "virtually unattainable."
- <u>EPA website</u> shows examples on how to improve business waste and recycling program in Griffin Georgia. One way to improve businesses to recycle was to tell businesses they could join the city collection program but they had to recycle. Increased public education and program promotion.
- <u>EPA Website</u> In Athens Georgia If down town wanted the City to
  pick up the garbage then it had to be in clear bags for them to pick
  up, this allows the collection company to ensure there is only garbage
  in the bag. The collection cost is a dollar a bag.
- <u>EPA Website</u> There was a kick off challenge in Clark County schools to collect plastic bags for recycling with the top producing school receiving a bench made from the composite lumber provided by a company called Trex.
- Website How 5 local governments just expanded their recycling programs. San Francisco has been one of the earliest and most ambitious adopters of new recycling programs in an effort to reach its goal of "zero waste" by 2020.
