

Due Date: Property tax payment is due by this date. Property owners need to make tax payment by this date to avoid late-payment penalties.

As a property owner in the City of Leduc, you receive a property tax notice every May. It indicates your share of municipal and education property taxes and the due date.


Total Assessment: The assessed value is an estimate of the market value as of July 1 of the previous year, and based on characteristics and physical condition as of December 31 as of the previous year. The assessed values are audited by the Provincial Government in order to ensure proper valuation practices have been followed.

Copy Sent to: A copy of the property tax notice is sent to your mortgage company if they collect your property taxes on your behalf along with your mortgage payment.

Municipal Property Taxes: A primary source of revenue for municipalities that is used to finance city programs and services such as social supports, parks and leisure facilities, police and fire protection, and public services, library, public transit

School Support -Public/Separate: In the City of Leduc, we have both Public and Roman Catholic school districts. When you purchase property in Leduc, you are required by the Province to complete the School Support Notice which directs your property taxes to either school district. All property owners in the City of Leduc, residential and non-residential, are required to pay education property taxes including those without children in school and senior citizens.

Total Payable: Property owners need to submit this payment amount by the due date in full to avoid late-payment penalties.

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Provincial Education Taxes: Provincial education property taxes are set by the Government of Alberta and directed to fund public and separate school boards. Each year, the City collects and forwards to the Government of Alberta the City of Leduc's portion of the total provincial education tax amount.
