Leduc Farmers Market







Dr. Woods House Museum



The Dr. Woods House Museum gives a charming glimpse into upper-middle-class life in the late 1920's to early 1940's. The museum offers educational programs, scheduled events and a tea room available to rent.

One of the area's first doctors, Dr. Robert Woods settled west of Leduc in 1902. He built this home, with the attached medical

wing, in 1927. The medical wing has been fully restored, with interior restoration and furnishings representative of the art deco period. The house itself features a craftsman-style design, with a low-pitched roof, fieldstone chimney and extensive interior wood working.

The museum is open all year long. In the off-season (September to June), the museum is open from Tuesday to Friday from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Summer hours are July 1 to August 31 by appointment only Tuesday to Saturday from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

The Older Adult Support Services Program

This provides information on services and programs for seniors and families caring for older adults within the City of Leduc. Some of the reasons people contact this program is to get assistance with:

- completing forms for government programs
- concerns associated with aging and care giving
- assistance with developing new programs for older adults
- information about city programs, and federal and provincial benefits for seniors

 information about emergency services, health support groups, community medical services, safety, etc.

The service also provides an Outreach program to seniors and to families caring for seniors. This one-on-one support service is available to connect seniors and adults with disabilities to community resources.

Meals on Wheels is another support service that is coordinated through the Older Adult Support Services program and is offered to those who are unable to prepare a nutritious meal. All meals are prepared by the Leduc Community Hospital and are delivered by a dedicated group of volunteers.

Homemaking Services is another part of the Older Adults Services program. The program provides help to seniors who are physically unable to do housework to maintain their independence and enhance their quality of life by helping with light housekeeping services.

Leduc Assisted Transportation Services (LATS)

Welcome aboard! Did you know that you can book a reservation trip up to three days in advance, or up to noon on the day before your trip?

You can also set up a subscription trip if you are going to the same place, on the same day of the week and at the same time each week. Subscriptions have to be a minimum of six weeks with no changes or adjustments during the six-week period.

To book a trip or to put a subscription into place, call Edmonton DATS at 780-986-5000 and choose "option 2".

For Monday trips

Call Friday, Saturday (any time), or Sunday (before noon)

For Tuesday trips

Call Saturday, Sunday (any time), or Monday (before noon)

For Wednesday trips

Call Sunday, Monday (any time), or Tuesday (before noon)

• For Thursday trips

Call Monday, Tuesday (any time), or Wednesday (before noon)

For Friday trips

Call Tuesday, Wednesday (any time), or Thursday (before noon)

For Saturday trips

Call Wednesday, Thursday (any time), or Friday (before noon)

For Sunday trips

Call Thursday, Friday (any time), or Saturday (before noon)

Doing laundry is most likely part of your every day routine. But did you know how important taking care of your clothes dryer is to the safety of your home? With a few simple safety tips you can help prevent a clothes dryer fire.

- Have your dryer installed and serviced by a professional.
- Do not use the dryer without a lint filter.
- Make sure you clean the lint filter before or after each load of laundry. Remove lint that has collected around the drum.
- Rigid or flexible metal venting material should be used to sustain proper air flow and drying time.
- Make sure the air exhaust vent pipe is not restricted and the outdoor vent flap will open when the dryer is operating. Once a year, or more often if you notice that it is taking longer than normal for your clothes to dry, clean lint out of the vent pipe or have a dryer lint removal service do it for you.
- Keep dryers in good working order. Gas dryers should be inspected by a qualified professional to make sure that the gas line and connection are intact and free of leaks.
- Make sure the right plug and outlet are used and that the machine is connected properly.
- Follow the manufacturer's operating instructions and don't overload your dryer.
- Turn the dryer off if you leave home or when you go to bed.

AND DON'T FORGET...

Dryers should be properly **grounded**.

Check the **outdoor vent** flap to make sure it is not covered by snow.

Keep the area around your dryer **clear** of things that can burn, like boxes, cleaning supplies and clothing, etc.

Clothes that have come in contact with **flammable substances**, like gasoline, paint thinner, or similar solvents should be laid outside to dry, then can be washed and dried as usual.

• The leading cause of home clothes dryer fires is failure to clean them.
