**WHEREAS;** Recommitment to ReconciliACTION is a day specific to the City of Leduc and allows us to reflect on the meaning and learnings from September 30, and to recommit to the process of reconciliation;

**WHEREAS;** this day also provides a chance to review the City's recent efforts to address reconciliation, and to identify the City's path forward;

**WHEREAS;** the City of Leduc acknowledges reconciliation as an ongoing effort that requires active participation and engagement;

**WHEREAS;** the City of Leduc pledges to actively support our Indigenous neighbours in the City of Leduc through participation and/or recognition of the following dates: National Day of Awareness for Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women, Girls, and Two-Spirit People on May 5, National Indigenous History Month each June, and National Indigenous Peoples
