DIY Hanger Tree


Supplies:


- 6 Hangers (preferably metal)
- Tape (hockey/sock, masking, duct, electrical)
- Scissors
- 2-3 Pkgs Greenery/Garland (green, frosted, or coloured)
- Mini Ornaments (approx. 24)
- Ornament Hangers or Wire

Optional: Battery operated string lights


Directions:

1. Take 2 hangers and lay them on top of one another with 1 corner from each hanger crossing over at the point. This is the top of the tree. The hooks should be facing out and the corners, close to you, pointing out. The bottom points are the bottom of the tree or "legs".





- 2. Make sure each hook is around the opposite hanger's long side. Blue hook should be around black hanger long side and vice versa.
- 3. Secure with tape at each crossing at the hook and the 2 corners together that meet at the top.
- 4. Repeat 3 times to make 3 triangles.
- 5. Link all 3 triangles by making them rest on the x inside the red circle. Stick one of the "legs" through another triangle at the x. It's a bit tricky but each of the 3 points should align.
- 6. Generously tape the 3 tops together after splitting the 6 legs equally.



- 7. Tape the X where all 3 triangles meet. This will take a few pieces of well-placed tape to hold things in place. You are looking to secure the legs in place so use your judgement.
- 8. Skip to 9 if not adding lights. To add lights, secure battery and switch to one of the legs at the bottom and then wrap the lights around the tree. Secure end with tape.
- 9. Once assembled, simply start at the top by securing the end of the garland/greenery with a piece of tape.
- 10. Wrap garland/greenery quite tightly around the tree until you reach the bottom. If you need to use more than one strand, simply tape end and start wrapping again after taping the end.
- 11. Now you are ready for decorations! If your garland is separating you can use some wire and secure the garland to the hangers for support.
- 12. Bonus you can unassembled your tree for easy storage!
