Sage brought the Women Building Futures, Supporting Women (or Youth) in Trades, to Junior High students which is a great opportunity to access funding. There is a Skills Competition for Women in Trades (Expo Trade in March). Neighbourhood Summit event had a great speaker, nice booths, and giveaways, and had about 20 participants. Households in Leduc are still going through some kind of respiratory distress/sickness.

Foster a sense of belonging. Promote social inclusion. Develop and maintain healthy relationships. Enhance access to social supports.
