A. Chair's Report

- The One Radio interviewed Wendy for the Spring Bird count.
- Wendy sent out a thank you to Kerra Chomlak for continuing the role on the LEAB board for the past 11 years. She welcomed Shelby Lowe to the board, and looks forward to working with her.

B. Council's Report

- There was a motion passed at Council to approve additional solar panels on the LRC, at the Sobey arena. These solar panel costs will be covered 80% from a federal grant and 20% from a provincial grant.
- There have been 200 solar panels placed on the RCMP building and 40 solar panels on the ECO station building.
- Starting the first week in August The City of Leduc will be moving
 to a complete on-demand service covering the entire municipality of
 Leduc where riders will be able to use an app or call centre to book a
 trip from wherever they are to wherever they need to go within the
 City limits. It will still be a ride share service.
- Council did not pass the bylaw for alcohol consumption in parks.

Action: Shelby will look into the LRC solar panels and see if they will be the largest in Canada or North America.

C. Administration's Report

- Shelby thanked LEAB for the warm welcome.
- Nathan Schafer has started with the City of Leduc and will be tracking the savings from solar panels, and will join the GHG subcommittee.

- Pesticides will be sprayed at the north end of Telford Lake this weekend. The City is spraying noxious weeds.

- C. Green House Gas (GHG) Plan and The Clean Energy Improvement Program (CEIP) Update from sub-committee
 - Meeting June 15, 2021 at 12:00 pm
- D. Dark Skies Update from sub-committee
 - Presentation from Kyley Marchuk, Strathcona County was on May 18, 2021.
 - Kiley explained on how the Strathcona County policy works and how the lighting is in their community.
 - LEAB sub-committee would like to meet again and see what they want to do next for the education component.

- E. Pollinator Garden Update
 - One of the teachers from the East Elementary School emailed LEAB and was thanked them for sending the seeds to the grade four and five students.

Action: Shirley email teachers regarding the seeds to ensure they were sent out.

- F. Single Use Plastics Update
 - "plastic manufactured items" were <u>added to schedule 1</u> of the Canadian Environmental Protection Act (CEPA). That means they are designated as "toxic" and means the government can proceed with their plans to ban certain plastic items, require post-consumer resin content etc, without introducing new legislation.
 - However, an industry group formed, called the <u>Responsible Plastic</u>
 <u>Use Coalition</u>, and they have <u>announced</u> that they will be taking the federal government to court over this.
 - Edmonton heard from their Council that they would like them to proceed with their bylaw and not be delayed by federal gov't or provincial EPR regulations. They had originally written in their waste reduction road map that the timing of a local bylaw would be aligned with federal and provincial regulation because they wanted their bylaw to be a backstop to those regs, but Council requested they update it to say "bylaw timing to be coordinated with, but not delayed by, the provincial Extended Producer Responsibility framework and the federal ban on specific single-use plastics."
- G. Green and Gold Update
 - RONA had 100 rain barrels in stock and sold out by May 31, 2021.
 There was 30 water timers in stock, and six were sold by May31, 2021.
