## **Chairman's Report**

- May 8, 2017 Katie Oliver did a presentation to Council about LEAB. Council appreciates what everyone in LEAB is doing. Articles distributed to LEAB members
- St. Albert Gazette, Native bees need help Members of the 2nd St. Albert Scouts used the instructions on the Edmonton and Area Land Trust website (ealt.ca) to build and distribute bee hotels to the St Albert Botanic Park and to members of St. Albert City Council.
- Alberta Farmer Express Farmers are setting up operation pollinator sites one to two acres of low productivity on their farms. The goal of the program is to plant wildflower seeds to establish and maintain new pollinator-friendly habitat over the long term. Farmers wishing to sign up can visit the SCCC website www.soilcc.ca.

- It was mentioned to Council that LEAB is planting the pollinator garden on June 5, 2017. LEAB was encouraged to write a letter to change the animal licensing and control bylaw for bee hotels in Leduc.
- Edmonton has been selected to host a first-ever international conference in March 2018 that looks at how cities can play a role in addressing climate change.
- Edmonton Journal Leduc County nears decision on controversial qun range.
- Leduc REP Saunders Lake bylaws receive second reading from Leduc County council.

#### Council's Report

- Council is realizing that the bee situation is happening all over Canada. It would be good to contact 2nd Leduc Scout Association to become involved in bee houses. Present to Council and let them know the time has come to allow bee houses in Leduc.
- Bee presentation will be held on May 17, 2017 at the Public Library at 6:30 p.m.
- Councillor Beverly Beckett congratulated Katie Oliver for winning the Citizens of Distinction Environmental Achievement Award 2017.

#### Administration's Report

- The Environmental Progress Report was presented to Council in May. This is the fifth year of the progress report plan, this is what was presented:
  - The LRC and OPS building solar project was a real milestone for the City. There will be an exhibit put up in the LRC explaining the solar program to residents.
  - Blue bag tonnage has gone down due to the usage of technology, and less phone books, paper, etc. in the waste stream.
  - Enhancing our natural areas with the Spring and Christmas Bird Count.
  - > Managing our water resources
  - > Energy conservation reducing our carbon footprint
- Air monitor has been placed at the dog park
- Integrated pest management plan is being developed and addresses invasive species and weed control.
- Green House Gas Inventory is complete.
