National Indigenous Peoples Day

WHEREAS, the Government of Canada acknowledges June as National Indigenous Heritage Month and National Indigenous Peoples Day on June 21 as a way to honour the history, heritage, and diversity of Indigenous People;

WHEREAS, the City of Leduc, located within Treaty Six Territory and Region 4 of the Métis Nation of Alberta, formally acknowledges that the land we now know as Canada is the traditional and modern-day territory of many First Nations, Inuit and Métis, and pays homage to these and all Indigenous peoples - past, present and future - that continue to contribute to the strength of our region and Turtle Island;
