A. Chairman's Report

City of Leduc launched a new app, helping residents understand everything they need to know about recycling. App is to replace the Sort Smarter app with some new features including being able to pair with voice command technology.

The Good Report (sent in by Lynne Chalmers) Alberta produces 40 per cent of Canada's honey. It's a \$60-million chunk of a multibillion-dollar industry worldwide. Bees are dying. One of the culprits is a fungal infection called Nosema ceranae —

an invasive parasite that affects bees around the world and decimates entire colonies. With the investment of donors, a U of A student research team is helping to protect honeybees and a multimillion-dollar Alberta industry.
