## A. Coal Policy - Update

# UNFINISHED BUSINESS

 the Government appointed Coal Policy Committee, consisting of 5 members, stated the number of public responses were exceptional and overwhelming.

They asked for an extension of the engagement report to Nov 15, which was granted by the Ministry of Energy.

Action: Shirley will set up a Coal Policy sub-committee meeting this month.

- B. Spraying fertilizer, pesticides, herbicides and Pollinator Garden Challenge Sub-committee update
  - October 14 was the sub-committee meeting LEAB acknowledged that the pollinator garden was not successful the last two years.

- LEAB would like to see more education on the use of pesticides and how they can harm individuals. They would like to combine the pollinator garden information with the pesticide information and make one pamphlet to hand out to residents. LEAB suggested to have a consultant help with the promotional material.
- LEAB is waiting to hear if they City receives a \$30,000.00 dollar budget approval by the end of November. This would be for a telephone survey on pesticides.
- LEAB would like recommendations from the pesticide survey to go to Council in May or June, 2022 to prepare for budget 2023.
- LEAB agreed to continue to move things forward with the pamphlets and monitor what is happening in the neighborhood's.
- LEAB would like to see if anything has changed at the Provincial or Federal level.
- LEAB are interested in utilizing some Pollinator Garden funds to use for residential pesticide education.
- LEAB discussed having volunteers help in planting a pesticide-free demonstration garden at the Leduc Community Gardens.

**Action**: Keri will set up a meeting for the Pesticide and Pollinator Garden subcommittee after the grant is approved.

- C. Green House Gas (GHG) Plan and The Clean Energy Improvement Program (CEIP) Update from sub-committee
  - CEIP administration will know by the end of October if we received the grant.
  - E-scooters went to executive and there are concerns, so this will go
    to council for decision on whether to proceed with a public
    consultation and recommended bylaw updates for a future pilot in
    2022.
- D. Dark Skies Update from sub-committee
  - On October 4 the sub-committee met to review and discuss the articles that Doug Hube sent to the REP to be published. These articles will be published when space is available.
  - Once the articles are published they will be posted on the LEAB website.
  - There will be a Dark Skies display set up in the Leduc Library by the end of October.

- A. Leduc Wildlife Conservation Society (LWCS) Buffers and Berms
  - There was an article published in the Leduc REP by the LWCS. They
    have concerns with the Leduc Industrial Park on the east side of
    Telford Lake. They feel that there should be some berms and buffers
    closer to the edge of industrial lots. The City of Leduc does have a
    Telford overlay plan that plans the landscaping, lighting for natural
    wildlife. There is municipal reserve and environmental reserve around

the lake however, it is thinner than they would like to see in some areas. LWCS will be looking into other municipalities and what they are doing for berms and setbacks.
