Bringing news from the City of Leduc to our LATS Clients

Are you new to transit?

Did you know that the City of Leduc's entire bus fleet is accessible? It is and that's because we know that all riders have different levels of mobility, and we want to give all riders access to the transit services they need.

Our 40' buses that travel between Edmonton's Century Park transit station and Leduc are low floor kneeler buses, meaning they can pull up to the curb and be at the same height as the sidewalk, making it convenient for someone with mobility issues to board. Our Route 10 buses are equipped with ramps which fold out onto the sidewalk to allow easy boarding access. Our On-Demand and LATS buses are equipped with lifts which makes boarding a breeze for our riders.

The City of Leduc offers travel training for both paratransit clients (LATS) and conventional transit riders, who use the public transit services. The training is free and benefits newcomers, people with disabilities, seniors and/or individuals who need help understanding how transit works. Training can be done over the phone, in person in group settings or one-on-one and instruction is tailored to the needs and abilities of the participant(s).

We teach you how to sign up for LATS and/or the On-Demand service. We will show you how to read maps and schedules, how to plan your trips, how to cancel your trips, where to purchase fare products, how to connect between LATS, On-Demand and Routes1 and 10 and much, much more.

If you are in a mobility device such as a wheelchair or scooter, having training prior to using the service can be very beneficial because it provides you with a chance to practice boarding the bus using a lift or ramp. You will also get to learn about our securement equipment and see us in action. This way, you are comfortable when you do ride with us.

It's time for you to have the freedom to go where you want, when you want! You will enjoy increased confidence and independence, better access to employment and volunteer opportunities, a means to travel and work, shop, dine out, attend school or church, visit the library, take in a movie or a play at the Maclab Centre and visit friends and family. Imagine the possibilities...

What can I bring onboard?

Clients are allowed to bring two bags on the bus only. We suggest you use canvas reusable bags as they are sturdier and can hold more items. Please understand that we cannot safely secure more than 2 bags per client. Items such as water and kitty litter are considered two items and therefore that would be all a client could bring on the bus at that time.

When to book a LATS trip

DATS Client Service Centre is open Monday to Friday from 7:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and from 7:30 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. on Saturday and Sunday. They can be reached at 780-986-5000, 'option 2'.

DATS menu options are as follows:

- Press 1 to cancel a trip or to check on a late ride.
- Press 2 to book or change a trip.
- Press 3 to register for DATS.
- **Press 4** to submit a commendation, concern, or any other inquiry.
- Press 5 for IVR self-serve options.
- Press 6 for subscription requests.

For Tuesday trips – Call Saturday or Sunday (any time), or Monday (before noon)

For Wednesday trips – Call Sunday or Monday (any time), or Tuesday (before noon)

A Fire Prevention Officer will come to check your alarms and advise on next steps. You may be eligible to receive a smoke/carbon monoxide alarm for your home.

Recipe Corner – Harvest Salad

For the salad:

- 1/2 cup cooked sweet potatoes, diced
- ½ cup cooked beets, diced
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 4 cup mixed greens, washed
- ¼ cup each of dried apricots, dried cranberries and crushed pecans

For the dressing:

- 2 tablespoons maple syrup
- 2 tablespoons apple cider vinegar
- 1 tablespoon balsamic vinegar
- 1 tablespoon whole grain Dijon mustard
- ¼ cup olive oil

Mix the dressing together and drizzle over the salad ingredients. Serve chilled and enjoy.



What's the difference between a mandatory attendant and a companion?

A 'mandatory attendant' (MA) is a person who is assigned to ride with you each and every time you ride with LATS. They would be assigned if you have a medical condition that makes travelling alone difficult for you. Your doctor will have checked this off when completing this part of your initial application to use LATS. When you have an MA assigned, you cannot book any trips with our bringing your MA along to assist you. The MA does not have to pay a fare.

Sometimes, it's nice to bring a friend along on your ride. This person is called a 'companion', but they are not there to assist you. They will have to pay a fare, and you will have to let the booking agent know when you book your ride that you are bringing a companion along. Please note that companion must be a minimum of 18+ years of age.

What do the fares cost for LATS and Leduc Transit?

Did you know both Leduc Transit and LATS accept many of the same fare products?

Travel within the City of Leduc, Edmonton International Airport and South Nisku:

Leduc Transit Monthly Pass: \$55 Local Pass for travel within the City of Leduc, Nisku & the Edmonton International Airport (valid on Route 10, On-Demand Transit and LATS)

Leduc Local Tickets: \$18/10 tickets (valid on Route 10, On-Demand Transit and LATS)

One-way Cash Fare within City of Leduc/Nisku: \$2

Canadian National Institute for the Blind (CNIB) cardholders: Free on all Leduc Transit and LATS

Travel to and from Edmonton:

To travel to and from Edmonton Century Park Transit Station, a rider can pay a **One-way Cash Fare of \$5**.

Additional fare products (Commuter monthly pass and Commuter Tickets) are available for those who commute between Leduc and Edmonton regularly. For the convenience of our riders who are travelling on Edmonton Transit as well as Leduc Transit, you may purchase any Leduc Transit fare product, as well as monthly Edmonton Transit Bus Passes at the following locations:
