What We Heard Report – March 2024

Project Overview

City of Leduc administration and Select Engineering conducted a community engagement to get feedback on the future development of an inclusive playground. Input was requested regarding specific amenity inclusion, landscaping considerations, concerns, and general comments regarding an inclusive playground.

Who We Engaged, When and How

Administration and Select Engineering hosted a drop-in engagement session at the Leduc Recreation Centre on January 31. An online survey was also open for more than two weeks for residents to submit their input and feedback. Approximately 586 users/residents provided feedback in person and through the online survey.

What We Asked

Input from participants was requested regarding specific amenity inclusion, landscaping considerations, concerns, and general comments regarding an inclusive playground.

What We Heard

Approximately 586 residents/users provided feedback in person and through the online survey. The most requested site and equipment amenities included:

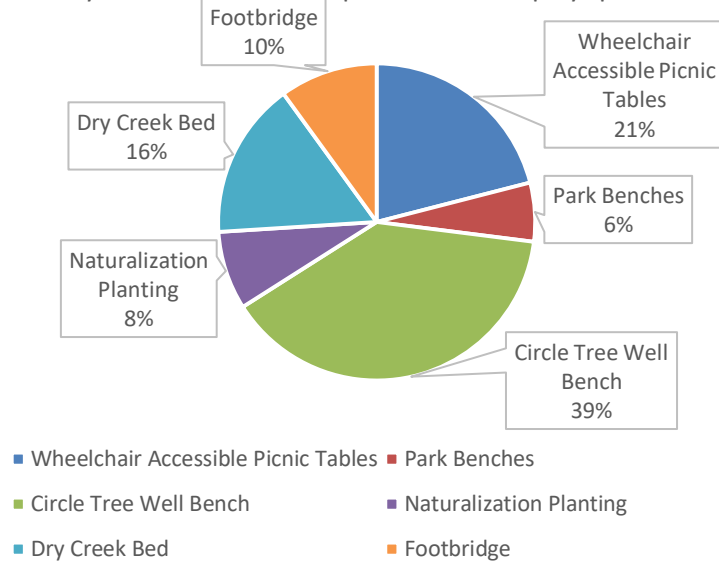
- Accessible picnic tables,

- A glider swing that is wheelchair accessible, and
- Parallel play opportunities.

What Happens Next

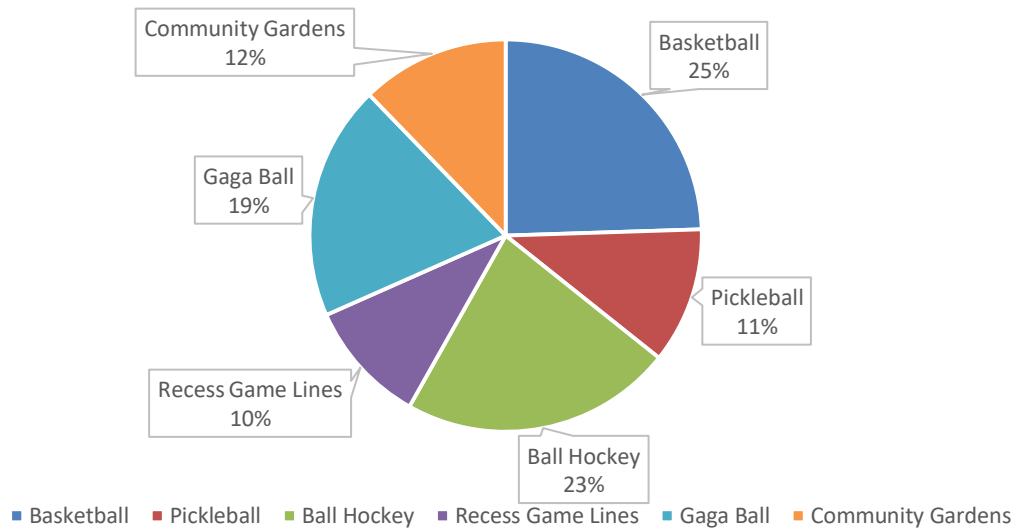
The input received in the public engagement will be used to inform the Request for Proposal for the project design.

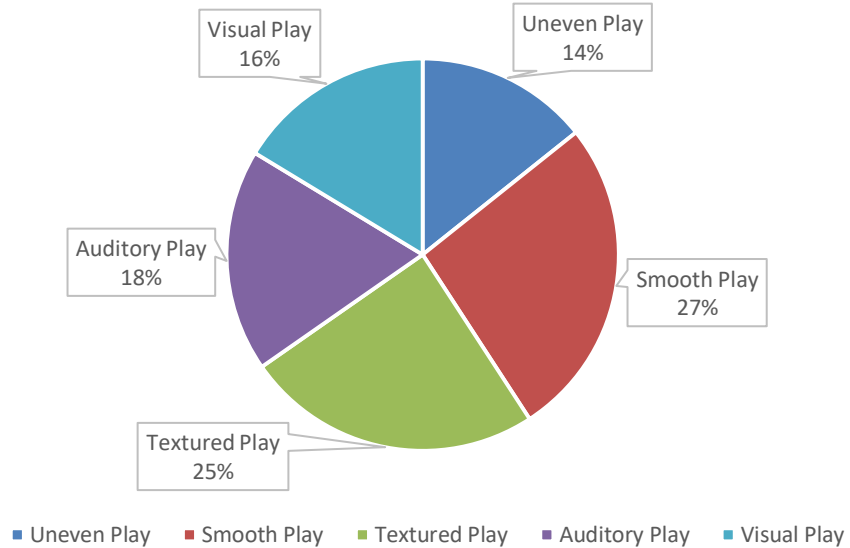
Other than the playground equipment, what other site landscaping would you like to see developed next to the play space?



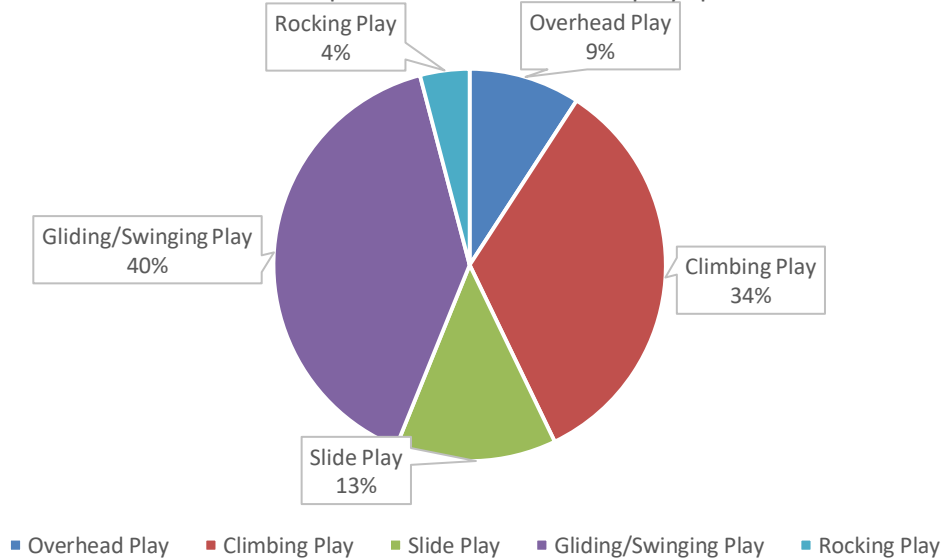
Other than the playground equipment, what other hardscape amenities would you like to see developed next to the play space?

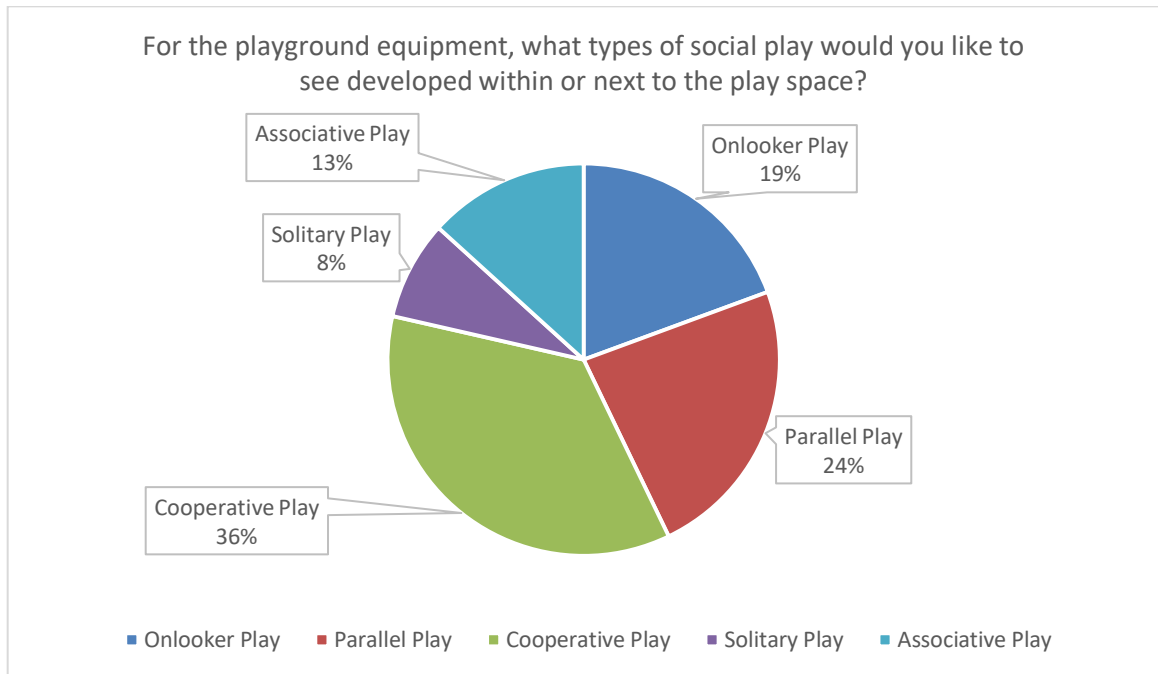


For the playground equipment, what types of sensory play would you like to see developed within or next to the play space?
