

Standby Worker

Standby Workers may have to fill any position in the voting station (see all Election worker job descriptions). As a result, Standby Workers are trained with the Voting Station Presiding Deputy Returning Officers (Voting Station PDRO).

- Experience supervising approximately 10 to 15 people
- Must possess mathematical, organizational, verbal and written communication skills
- Must provide vehicle as may be required to transport election materials, depending on position deployed to, and possess appropriate insurance and a valid Driver's License
- Must provide own cell phone while on duty for communication with Election Central, as required

Standby Workers may be called at any time on Election Day. You will be required to have your cell phone on at all times during Election Day to accept a call from Elections Central.

Requirements for all positions:

- Minimum age of 16 years; youth (ages 16 and 17) must have parent or guardian approval
- Previous election experience preferred
- Ability to communicate tactfully and courteously with the public
- Must be able to work in a fast-paced environment
- Must be physically able to lift supplies weighing up to 30lbs (13kg)
- Must attend a mandatory training session
- Must have a social insurance number (SIN) and be able to present a Revenue Canada document containing your SIN to payroll, if hired
- Other duties as required
