

# Understanding Utility Fees

Utility fees are changing in 2026 — you will likely see an increase in your monthly bill.

Utility fees fund essential services like drinking water, wastewater treatment, stormwater systems, and waste collection. These services rely on a mix of City operations and regional systems.

Most of the 2026 water and wastewater rate changes reflect costs set by external service providers: Arrow Utilities and the Capital Region Southwest Water Services Commission. The City collects these fees through utility bills to pay for the services and infrastructure required to deliver reliable water and wastewater service to Leduc.

The City has also adjusted its own utility rates to ensure local systems remain safe, well-maintained, and able to support our growing community.

## 2026 Utility Fee Changes

*The amounts below show how utility rates used to calculate your bill have changed from 2025 to 2026.*

Utility	Increase from 2025
Water (residential)	Fixed rate: 22¢ per month Usage rate: 20¢ per cubic meter
Wastewater	Fixed rate: 20¢ per month Usage rate: 86¢ per cubic meter
Stormwater	\$1 per month
Solid Waste	77¢ per month

*Your utility bill shows total charges only and does not break out individual rate components (fixed rate vs. usage rate). Actual bill impacts vary depending on water use.*

- Clean, safe drinking water
- Reliable wastewater and stormwater systems
- Ongoing maintenance of critical infrastructure
- Long-term sustainability of utility services
