

Public Skate Guidelines

Your guide to having an enjoyable indoor skating experience for all ages.

Wristbands and Admission

Designated wristbands must be always worn in proof-of-payment areas.

Skate Supervision

Active Participation is required - children 7 years of age and under must be accompanied on the ice by a supervisor 14 years of age or older.

Supervision ratios are 1:4.

Shoes/outdoor footwear are not permitted on the ice.

Skate Safe

We value the safety and wellness of all our patrons, which is why we strongly encourage all skaters to wear a helmet, and skaters 12 years of age and under **MUST** wear a helmet (CSA certified in recommended). Skates are required to be worn by all patrons while on the ice surface.

Avoid Collisions

To avoid collisions all skaters should travel in the same direction around the ice avoiding excessive speed, and games. If you are a speedy skater stay along the boards while slower skaters stay towards the center of the ice.

Public Skating Reminders

To keep everyone safe objects such as sticks, rings, and pucks are not permitted on the ice. Public skate is a leisure opportunity not intended for training such as ice hockey, figure skating, drills, and timing.

Skating is for Everyone

- Wheelchairs: Our arenas are wheelchair accessible so everyone can participate in our activities.
- Please ensure the wheelchair is clean, free of debris and that the chair can be fully controlled while on the ice.
- Skate Aids: We encourage the assistance of our skate aids for beginner skaters.
- Personal skate aids must not have sharp edges or points and be approved by staff prior to use on the ice.
- For their safety, children are not permitted to be carried while on the ice.
- Walking sticks, wagons, sleds, child seats, and strollers are not permitted on the ice as they may damage the ice and risk your safety.

Max Participants

To keep a safe and enjoyable experience for all patrons, Public Skate is limited to 100 participants.

General Reminders

Public Skate guidelines are to enhance your experience during your skate. It does not replace the City of Leduc, Recreation Services Conditions of Use and Expectations.
